Objective of the Orientation:

The main objective of the orientation program was to:

Orientation Summary:

He also highlighted the following key points:

- Each student will be assigned a Field Project Supervisor, who will monitor, guide, and assess the project.
- The duration, structure, and format of the project were explained.
- Students were introduced to their respective supervisors for one-on-one guidance.

Mr. Amardeep Gurme elaborated on the mandatory documents to be maintained throughout the project process, including:

- Field Project Proposal
- Supervisor Allotment Sheet
- Daily/Weekly Progress Logs
- Final Report Format
- Evaluation Criteria

He stressed that each student will receive a distinct topic, aligned with their academic specialization, and that timely submission is crucial for internal assessment.

Outcome of the Orientation:

- 35 students and staff members actively participated in the orientation session.
- Students gained a clear understanding of the objectives, structure, and expectations of the field project.
- Roles of supervisors and timelines were well communicated, ensuring preparedness among students.
- The session fostered academic responsibility and project planning among the learners.
