The organization then allotted some coordinators for the students and enable them to explore with the students at the slum areas, to ensure the safety and privacy of the students, staff and the people staying at Patil Vasti. The visit ended with vote of thanks provided by Mr. Amardeep Gurme, Staff from MES Night College of Arts & Commerce. Mr. Amardeep Gurme and Mr. Shiv Kumar were the coordinators for the activity.

The college staff informed the students of S.Y.B.A. & SYB.Com. to arrive at the location at 11 a.m. and then the students and staff were welcomed by the coordinator of the organization, Dr. Vishnu Shrimangale. Dr. Shrimangale introduced the visitors with his other managers and colleagues. He informed about the organization, working of the organization, its goals and its various activities/ initiatives. Dr. Vishnu briefed the students about the conduct of CEP Activity and also explained the socio-economic and lifestyles of the people staying at Patil Vasti, Shivajinagar. He explained why there is a need to do engage with the society and as a citizen what can we do to contribute socially for upliftment of people staying at slums.
